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### **Philosophy**

The sites visited in each of the courses in the series, Our National Treasures, present inquisitive participants with many facets of our cultural heritage. The course experience itself is an exploratory process that is as much to be valued as the sites themselves. As a curious lifelong learner one must perform research in order to discover answers that lead to more questions and more research. Thus in this course, the participant prepares for the site visit by conducting investigations to gain a better appreciation of the knowledge and inspiration that the national treasure will offer. At the locale itself, questions are posed that further one's desire to engage in additional study. Therefore touring the site and becoming engrossed in the process becomes the true national treasure.

### **Course Description**

Walking along the National Mall moving from monument to monument and memorial to memorial is an experience that melds information and inspiration within the learning process. This class will bring such an experience to the participating teacher.

### **Course Objectives**

#### **Teachers will:**

1. walk along the national Mall as they visit different monuments and memorials.
2. visit and study three monuments, four memorials and one reflecting pool.
3. take photos during their mall walking experience.
4. relate their thoughts and feelings both during the mall walk and at the sites.
5. reflect on and communicate the experience of combining information with inspiration.

### Section 1 - Photos

- 1A. Submit a photo of yourself at each of the seven sites and the **Lincoln Reflecting Pool**.
- 2B. Submit your favorite photo (without you in it) of each of the **three most** inspirational (for you) sites.
- 3C. Explain the significance to you of the sites chosen.

### Section 2 - Knowledge (combining information and feelings)

- 2A. Using the information given you in the above resources and/or your own experience, **list** something you learned or relearned from each of the Memorials or Monuments.
- 2B. Reflect upon the feelings you experienced as you walked from one site to the other as well as at the sites themselves (you do not have to express a feeling for every site). **Convey** those feelings **in writing**.
- 2C. Was there any difference between the feelings that you had at a monument compared with a war memorial – explain.

### Section 3 – Communicating Your Experience

Your school's PTA has been divided on whether to spend money on Government class students to go on a field trip to Washington D.C. or for up to date governmental materials to be used in the classroom. Because you have taken this class your principal has asked you to address the PTA on why travel, when planned properly, is a far superior experience for the student than just studying material in the classroom. You have entitled your presentation "**Combining Information with Inspiration to enhance lifelong learning.**"

- 3A. How will you use your pictures taken for Section 1 to inspire PTA members? You need not show-just explain.
- 3B. Write out the introduction that you will use in your address.
- 3C Outline the body of your address.
- 3D Write out the conclusion of your address.

Write about how the information, inspiration and ideas gleaned from the National Treasures you visited could enhance your classroom teaching?
