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Syllabus

Course Description

The purpose of this self-paced class is to provide teachers with the opportunity to tour exhibits at outstanding museums such as the Fresno Art Museum, Arte Americas, Las Casa de la Cultura, in Fresno, the Tulare County Museum, the Sanger Depot Museum, the Reedley Museum, and the Agricultural Museum, also in Tulare. An extensive list of museums in and outside our valley will be provided. Learning about the unique educational programs these museums provide can then be shared by each teacher at their school site and in their classroom through fieldtrip opportunities, cultural activities, online web experiences, and high-interest curriculum.

Course Objectives

1. Teachers will learn what educational programs and other opportunities are available for their students at four outstanding educational museums.
2. By participating in tours of the exhibits in the selected four museums, teachers will further their knowledge of art culture, history, science, natural history, agriculture, etc., that can be taken back to the classroom and incorporated into the curriculum.

3. Teachers will gain the knowledge to plan and teach meaningful art lessons and activities for their grade level.
4. Teachers will be able to provide field trip information for parents and staff and plan meaningful fieldtrips that enrich the curriculum of grade level taught.

Class Requirements:

1. Enroll online at www.dominicanCAonline.com. See website for registration and also for location of informational meetings that are scheduled in the area or call 559-225-9020 for that information. Coursework will be available at all Spring/summer registration/informational meetings.
2. Participants will tour four museums of their choice and at their convenience. Two museums highly recommended for teachers are: The Fresno Art Museum, and the Arte Americas, both in Fresno. While two of the four museums toured are required to be from the local San Joaquin Valley area, two of the four museum visits may be from outside the valley.

A list of local museums available for touring is provided. It is always advisable to call ahead for the days/hours a museum is open to the public and for the current admission costs of each, as changes can occur without notice. It is also highly recommended that teachers call ahead to request a docent-guided tour to get the most out of the exhibits. Parking is usually free at each local museum.

After completing the tour of a museum, the Passport Page should be stamped and/or signed, as well as dated by the museum docent or receptionist as proof of the visit. Teachers should be prepared to take notes on certain exhibits. Photos, if allowed, can also be included in the coursework as proof of visitation.

3. A written reflection on each museum visit is required. The written reflections should be typed, double spaced, with size 10-12 size font, or legibly written in pen. Reflection write-ups should be one or more pages in length, and should address every question posed on the coursework. Grading: The Passport page, four thoughtfully written museum reflections, and the Summary and Evaluation pages must be completed on time for an “A” grade. Coursework not received by the deadline may be subject to a lower grade. Please inform the instructor if more time is needed to complete the course. Also, please note that the work for a one-unit university graduate class is a required 15 hours.

Instructions for coursework submission:

Written Assignments

Your coursework should be created in a document that can be emailed directly to the instructor.

Coursework should be typed, double-spaced with size 12 font. Reflection write-ups should be one or more pages in length and address every question in the coursework. Pictures and documents may be scanned and posted along with your Word or PDF file of written assignments. Label everything carefully with the assignment number and make sure that your name and email address are easy to locate.

Visit four sites and submit responses for EACH location.

IMPORTANT - Camera images can be very large files. Save the images in lower definition resolution in order to keep document file sizes down for emailing.

Winery Ave. Hours are from 9-4 p.m., Mondays-Fridays and 10-4 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. Free admission. No docents are on site due to budget cuts. 6. Describe at least one enrichment activity that would supplement a visit to this museum. List at least one relevant website.
