Course Overview

Enhance the learning in your Early Childhood Classroom through music and rhythm. Explore how young learners' pre-reading skills, comprehension, engagement, classroom management and behavior improve through the use of music and rhythm. You will research and curate examples of music and rhythm to incorporate into your existing curriculum and units of study. Participants do not need to be currently teaching in an Early Childhood classroom or have a musical background to benefit from this course.

Course Objectives

In this course, participants will

- Examine how music and rhythm promote learning in Early Childhood Classrooms
- Describe how existing curriculum can be enhanced through music and rhythm
- Discover specific examples of music and rhythm that can be used in all areas of the Early Childhood classroom to promote student learning
- Create and share a Symbaloo to organize all of your digital resources of music and rhythm for your classroom
- Build a plan, using examples of music and rhythm, to enhance the learning in an Early Childhood classroom

Module #3 : Disco	over and Reflect		
Objective	There are many examples of music and rhythm currently in use and available for teachers. Examples include the movement song "Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes" and familiar nursery rhymes. Research (find), curate (keep the good ones) a list of examples of music and rhythm that could be used in all areas of Early Childhood classrooms.		
Assignment	A) Complete 8 hours of research. In a subsequent Module, you will organize your digital resources, so be sure you have adequate resources from your research to be able to complete Module 4. List at least 20 appropriate examples of music and rhythm for an Early Childhood classroom. You can use these categories to get started, and add more, as needed. -Pre-reading skills -Comprehension -Engagement Strategies -Curriculum Areas -Classroom Management -Behavior Expectations -Classroom Procedures -SEL (Social Emotional Learning) Consider researching Blogs, YouTube videos, Teachers pay Teachers, Pinterest, Google search, your local library for song books, rhythm books, chants, jump-rope rhymes, etc. Search using keywords such as: chants, songs, attention grabbers, classroom management, songs for lining up, Classroom management, engagement strategies, behavior management, songs for learning colors, chants for learning shapes, etc. If your example is a video, you must preview the whole video. Some resources are better than others. Some have voices that are easier to listen to than others. Some do not cover what the title implies. You need to watch		
	the whole example before adding it to your list or using it in the classroom in front of children. Here are some possible resources to include in your research:
