Objective	Create a website using CANVA website builder.	
Assignment(s ) Include Activities and Needed Materials	Choose a template from the Canva Website Builder or start with a blank website. Review the <u>tutorial</u> here and <u>here</u> . Create a website that contains a minimum of 6 pages. The website should be a portfolio type of website that includes 5 main takeaways from the course. Your pages can include examples of things you created or design principles and key concepts to remember.	
Assessment	CV9: Create a 6 page website. The first page should be a title page and then the following 5 pages are designated to 5 takeaways from the course and how you will implement them into your classroom or educational setting. Each page should include good design principles. Make sure you have a menu for each page-this can be done by naming each of the pages in grid view.
