Course Overview:

Examine the varying co-teaching models in the early childhood classroom and discover how these models promote high quality teaching and learning for diverse learners. Explore best practices for building and maintaining respectful and effective co-teaching relationships. Devise a plan to effectively communicate and collaborate with special educators as you create a more inclusive learning environment.

- Examine and explore co-teaching models in the early childhood classroom.
- Evaluate co-teaching strategies for increasing students' motivation and engagement.
- Establish the purpose and goals for co-teaching in the early childhood classroom and plan for differentiated instruction.
- Design a plan to effectively collaborate with special educators and para educators in the co-taught early childhood classroom.
